REMARKS

On 8/27/2020 I, Detective Martz, received information that Sean Carey may be in possession of stolen items, which would be located in a red car at 174 Prospect St., the residence of Carey.

The stolen items had been described by the victim, _____, as being a Dewalt tool bag with power tools, and a Husky tool bag with hand tools. The power tools had been marked with the initials "JG" in sharpie black marker.

Myself and Detective Semper went to 174 Prospect St. There was a red car in the driveway as described. I looked into the vehicle and Sean Carey was seated in the driver's seat, reclined, and appeared to be asleep or unconscious. I contacted Central Communications to send a uniformed Officer to assist in checking on the well being of Carey. Officer Gagne arrived on scene a short time later.

Officer Gagne and I approached the vehicle. Officer Gagne noted a hypodermic needle in plain sight on Carey's lap. This type of needle is commonly used to inject heroin or fentanyl. I observed a cordless drill and backpack in plain sight. Officer Gagne knocked on the window and Carey woke up. He was asked to step out of the vehicle and he complied.

I spoke with Carey regarding the stolen property. He denied having any stolen items, but gave his consent to search the vehicle. He indicated his consent by signing and initialing a Middletown Police Consent to Search and Examine Evidence form.

The search of the vehicle revealed the following items of evidence or contraband:

- #1 DeWalt Cordless Impact Drill - \$150 value.
- #2 DeWalt Cordless Band Saw - \$200 value.
- #3 16" Level - \$20 value.
- #4 Red Husky bag of assorted non power tools - \$150 value.
- #5 Makita Impact Drill - \$100 value.
- #6 Assorted non power tools in black plastic case - \$50 value.
- #7 Socket wrench set in a green case - \$20 value.
- #8 CarQuest charger \$50 value.
- #9 "Gold" NFL Cowboy's ring - \$200 value.
- #10 ^{Silver color} Silver wristwatch - \$60 value.
- #11 Assorted tools - \$20 value.
- TOTAL \$1,020.00 value.
- #12 (4) White Wax Paper baggies "Fentanyl" baggies 2.8 grams
- #13 (2) Hypodermic needles
- #14 "Crack pipe" glass pipe with burnt residue and copper wool
- #15 White pouch with nail clipper set.

The Dewalt tools were immediately recognized as being the stolen items due to all having "JG" written in sharpie black marker. The Husky tool bag was also located next to the Dewalt tool bag. These items were later positively identified as belonging to the victim at police headquarters.

Carey was told that he was under arrest for possession of stolen property. He was told to place his hands behind his back. He then pulled away from Officers, and attempted to flee. Officer Gagne's handcuffs were knocked out of his ^{hand} during the struggle. Officer Gagne and Detective Semper took hold of Carey, and placed him on the ground, and I was able to handcuff him at that time.

All the above listed items were tagged as evidence. The suspected fentanyl was tested by Detective Laskowski with a Nark 33 Fentanyl/Heroin field test kit, which yielded a positive result for the presumptive presence of Fentanyl. The total weight of the wax paper bags and evidence packaging was 2.8 grams. The

powder present appeared to be one fentanyl dosage unit.

Carey was transported to police headquarters by Officer Gagne. He was processed following standard booking procedure without incident. After being informed of his rights and signing an advisement of rights form, Carey stated that the stolen items were given to him to hold by a man named "Bear". This was possible a nickname for


Sean Carey was charged with violation of CGS 53a-125 Larceny 4th Degree, CGS 53a-167 Interfering with Police, CGS 21a-279 (a) Possession of Narcotics, CGA 21a-267(a) Possession of Drug Paraphernalia. Carey was held on a \$25,000 surety bond, and given a court date of 8/28/2020 at 09:00 hours at GA-9.
