REMARKS

On 09-16-2020 at 1606 hours, I, Officer Haddad, responded to Hartford Avenue and Route 9 on the anonymous report of a man asking for money from passing cars. The complaint stated that the panhandling man had almost caused an accident, because someone had slammed on their car's brakes to give him money.

Upon arrival I saw no man begging for money at that location. A short time later, Officer Pixley notified me that he could see Brett Caswell and walking away from the area of Hartford Avenue. He stated that they were near the railroad tracks on Rapallo Avenue. He stated that Brett Caswell is often a subject who panhandles at Hartford Avenue and Route 9. Officer Pixley was at an accident scene on Rapallo Avenue and could not leave his location. When I arrived at the railroad tracks Brett Caswell was gone.


A short time later I saw Brett Caswell and walking on Main Street near Rapallo Avenue. I stopped them and Brett Caswell admitted that he had been begging for money at Hartford Avenue and Route 9. He stated this without being questioned, as it appeared obvious that he was aware of why I was approaching him. He stated that he panhandles for money at Hartford Avenue and Route 9 often, as he has no other way to support his drug habit. Caswell admitted that he has been warned several times not to beg


for money, or interfere with traffic, at that specific intersection.

Caswell also admitted that when he stopped cars to collect money from the occupants, it caused a traffic backup. On this date, as I initially approached Route 9 on Hartford Avenue, traffic was at a stand still.

Brett Caswell was arrested for Disorderly Conduct, 53a-182, for blocking vehicular traffic. He was transported to the Middletown Police Headquarters and he was processed on that charge. He was issued a court date of November 18, 2020. Caswell was released on a \$500.00 dollar non surety bond.

REMARKS

On 9/9/2020, at approximately 11:52 hours, I, Officer Foss-Rugan along with other Middletown Officers responded to Rappallo Avenue for a disturbance.

During the course of the investigation, the accused, Kyle C. Wright was asked to produce his identification. Upon his wallet being opened, several small wax unmarked baggies were seen. It is known through officers training and experience that narcotic users typically store Heroin or Fentanyl in these baggies.

A total of eleven wax like baggies were removed from Wright's wallet. Wright said that during the course of the disturbance, the drugs must have been planted in his wallet by the two other involved females. Wright said that the females took his wallet out of his backpack to take his money and that is what started the disturbance.

Wright was issued a Misdemeanor Summons for 21a-279a- Possession of Narcotics with a court date of 11/4/2020 at 09:00 hours at Middlesex Superior Court.

The substance was tested with a Nark Kit and it tested positive for the presence of Fentanyl. The total weight of the substance including baggies was 2.34 grams.
