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On 04/09/21 at approximately 15:53 hour(s) this officer (Sgt. Baboolal) was working dayshift when an call came in from a person reporting that the operator was texting while operating green Jeep traveling south on Rte 9 approaching the Arrigoni bridge, with no registration plate visible. I went to the turn around location and waited for the jeep to approach. I observed the Jeep traveling south with a single black male operator.

I was able to get behind the Jeep and stop it just prior to Exit 15 (Washington St). I walked up and there was a temporary paper registration plate taped on the inside of the rear window. The registration was Texas. The rear window was slightly tinted which made the registration plate not visible. I called in the registration to dispatch. On further investigation it is clearly written on the paper registration that the registration was valid for only 144 hours and that it was only valid in the State of Texas. When questioned on where he got the registration, he said he was able to buy it online and print it out. The registration plate was valid from 10/15/20 thru 10/21/20. The operator presented a North Carolina driver license, license #

This license returned as being valid. The operator was identified as Chandler B. Barrie through this license. The online computer system showed, and dispatch returned with a Connecticut IDCard for the operator, CTID# . Barrie could not provide any current/ valid insurance for the vehicle. He tried to pull the insurance up on his cell phone but it showed the policy was cancelled. When asked if he was texting while driving and he said he was looking down on his map application on his cell phone. I told him he should get a cell phone holder so it is not in his hand while driving.

I had Barrie pull into the parking lot just off of Exit 15 on the corner of Washington St at De Koven Dr. I

On 1/18/2021 at approximately 2226 hrs, I, Officer Tiano, was on patrol in the area of the Community Health building located at 675 Main Street in a marked Middletown Police Patrol vehicle. While driving through the parking lot that is accessed off of Grand Street, I saw a tan colored Honda Accord bearing CT Reg. parked in the north western corner of the parking lot backed in. While passing by the vehicle, I saw there was a person seated in the driver's seat that appeared to be hunched over the steering wheel. This person was later positively identified by his CT issued identification card as the accused, Brandon A. Bell.

During the course of this investigation, Bell was found in the vehicle unconscious and was hunched over in the driver's seat. The vehicle was off however the keys remained in the ignition. When Bell was awoken, he displayed demeanor that indicated he was under the influence of drugs and/or alcohol.

While standing outside of the passenger side window of the vehicle that was rolled down, I could see in plain view there was the remains of a small, hand rolled cigarette in a brown colored leaf like wrapper. The cigarette was burnt on one end indicating it was recently smoked. Due to my training and experience as a police officer, I recognized this type of cigarette to be commonly associated with marijuana usage. When Bell was question about this item, he claimed someone had recently smoked marijuana inside his vehicle. A search of Bell and his vehicle was conducted. While the search of Bell yielded negative results, during the search of the vehicle, in a slide out compartment on the dash board that was to the left of the steering wheel, a small square shaped zip top plastic bag containing a small amount of a black/dark brown colored leaf like substance. Upon viewing this item, due to my training and experience as a Police Officer, I was familiar with this substance to be consistent with PCP (Phencyclidine). In viewing the hand rolled cigarette that was resting on the passenger side seat, I saw it contained the same black/dark brown colored leaf like

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substance that was found inside the small plastic bag indicating it was also PCP that had been recently been smoked.

Both items were seized as evidence and later field tested. Using Nark Kit #09 (PCP Reagent) both items tested positive for the presumptive present of Phencyclidine. Both items were later weighed on a department issued scale. The small bag of suspected PCP had a total combine weight of .41 grams (evidence item #1). The hand rolled cigarette containing suspected PCP had a total combined weight of .10 grams (evidence item #2). Both items were photographed and tagged as evidence then submitted to our evidence department.

In running Bell's vehicle registration plate (CT Reg. _____) by radio through our dispatch center for a DMV records check. The registration came back to a 1993 Ford F-150 color green to a party out of East Haddam. The registration status was listed as suspended due to insurance compliance. In running the vehicles VIN number through our dispatch center, the plate last registered to the vehicle was cancelled due to the reason of being sold. In later questioning Bell about the registration plates on the vehicle he acknowledged the registration plates were a misuse and stated the vehicle currently didn't have active an insurance policy.

At the conclusion of this investigation, Bell was issued a misdemeanor summons (#MC732757) for the offenses of C.G.S. 21a-279(a)(1) Possession Narcotics, C.G.S. 14-147 Misuse Registration, C.G.S. 14-213b Insufficient Insurance and C.G.S. 14-12a* Operation of an Unregistered Motor Vehicle. He was issued a court date of 4/19/2021 at 0900 hrs at Middlesex Superior Court G.A. 9. After Bell signed the summons acknowledging his court date, he was released on a Promise to Appear. Bell remained in hospital custody for further evaluation.

Upon arrival, I met with Victim #1 (V1) who advised that on the above date at approximately 1130 hours, Gary Watson randomly messaged her over Facebook stating the following "Did you honestly think you were going to get away with what you did to me without consequences? Had you actually made an effort to get to know me, you would have known this is not the case. There will be a reckoning. And you will pay for what you did to me. Mark my words. You will pay."

V1 stated the message caused her alarm and she now fears for her safety. She provided me with a screen shot of the message.

Officers then responded to Watson's residence to speak with him. He admitted to sending the Facebook message, stating that he meant V1 was going to pay him because he is in the process of suing her. However, he advised that he understands how the message would come across as alarming.

Watson was subsequently charged with violating CGS: 53a-181 Breach of Peace in the 2nd Degree. He is scheduled to appear in court on 4/13/2021 at 0900 hours at Middlesex Superior Court (GA09).

On 4/13/21 at approximately 0308 hours, I was dispatched to an undisclosed address for an initial report of a suspicious person. The call was later reclassified as a domestic. Ofc. Tavares assisted on this call.

During the course of the investigation it was released that Daniel Orlich (55) was in violation of an active protective order in which he is the respondent and the Victim is the protectee. There are a total of three active orders. However, only one order which was entered into on 11/16/2020 indicates the violation. The stipulations on that protective order are as follows:

- CT01 - Do not assault, threaten, abuse, harass, follow or interfere with or stalk the protected person
- CT03 - Stay away from the home of the protected person and wherever the protected person shall reside
- CT 14 - Responded may return to the protected person's home one time with Police to retrieve belongings, and CTF - Surrender or transfer all firearms or ammunition.

Orlich was asked if he knew there was a protective order in which he was not allowed at the residence. He stated that he knew there was one but it was modified and he was allowed there.

Orlich was escorted and seated in the rear of my cruiser. I then transported him to police headquarters for the arrest and booking process which was completed by Ofc. Tavares.

A Check indicated that Orlich has 2 counts of Violation of a Protective Order, 1 count of Disorderly Conduct, 1 count of Criminal Trespass 2nd Degree, and 1 count of Unlawful Restraint 2nd Degree.

On April 11, 2021 at approximately 0126 hours, officers responded to the area of 695 Main Street, Eli Cannon's, for the report of an assault. Dispatch advised responding officers that the caller had the phone taken from him by another party that said they had been "play fighting" before disconnecting the call by hanging up.

Once in the area officers made an investigative stop on CT Reg: _____ s it was being pointed out by a witness as the suspect vehicle. The witness also advised officers that the front seat passenger, Christopher Rex, who was later identified by his CT ID Card had a gun on him.

Officers made contact with Christopher who was making furtive movements while seated in the vehicle and not following verbal commands. Christopher eventually began to follow commands and was detained. Christopher told officers several times that he did have a gun on him, but after a search of his person and wingspan in the vehicle none were located.

Officers investigated the matter and found that Christopher had been in a fight with an unknown black male while taking out the trash from his work. Christopher stated that he and the male got into a verbal argument which turned physical, before they each went their separate ways. Christopher stated that he was then picked up by his brother, who was waiting for him to get out of work.

Once he was in his brothers vehicle Christopher got into another verbal argument, this time with the witness that initially pointed the vehicle out to them. Christopher said that the argument never became

physical and that he did not threaten a weapon.

The witness, _____ identified by prior police interactions reported that he saw Christopher and the male fighting by the trash dumpster and tried to break them up. Allen said that once Christopher was picked up and in the vehicle he began to yell at him. Allen reported that Christopher exited the vehicle and walked toward him with his hand tucked into the stomach of his shirt acting as if he had a gun, although Christopher never said he had a gun. Allen confirmed that the argument never became physical.

We also interviewed Christopher's brother, _____ who was identified by his CT Driver License. _____ reported that he was picking Christopher up from work when he learned he had been in a fight. _____ told us he went to call 911 and Christopher took his phone from him and ended the call.

_____ also reported that Christopher got into a verbal argument with _____ when they were going to leave and that Christopher exited the vehicle. _____ told us that Christopher did not say he had a gun but made comments to Allen that insinuated that he had a weapon.

Christopher was subsequently arrested and charged with violation of C.G.S. 53a-183b Interfering with an Emergency Call, 53a-181 Breach of Peace in the Second Degree and 53a-167a Interfering with an Officer. Christopher was photographed, fingerprinted and his demographics were updated.

While being processed Christopher made comments concerning his mental health and EMS was requested. Christopher was brought by ambulance to Middlesex Hospital where officers completed a Police Request for Emergency Evaluation form.

Christopher was released on a \$25,000.00 non-surety bond and is scheduled to appear at GA-09 in Middletown on July 6, 2021 at 0900 hours to face said charges.
