COST INFORMATION

The U. S. grant of \$750,000.00 from EDA (U.S. Department of Commerce) that has been offered means:

<u>Real Savings:</u>	60% Federal Share	\$ 750,000.00
	40% Middletown's Share	500,000.00
		<u>\$1,250,000.00</u>

Very Small Budget Increase: Less than one-tenth of 1% of the City's annual budget for the bonding period.

Hardly Any Increase In Mill Rate: Based on Grand List, no real effect on tax rate.

Less Than \$2.00 Per Household: Annual cost to any household estimated at \$1.88 or less for twenty years.

Potential Future Development Funding: New projects related to waterfront expansion may attract additional Federal aid.

Genuine Commitment To Future Of Middletown: Commercial, industrial potential, expanded tax revenues, means more vigorous economy, more stable tax rates.

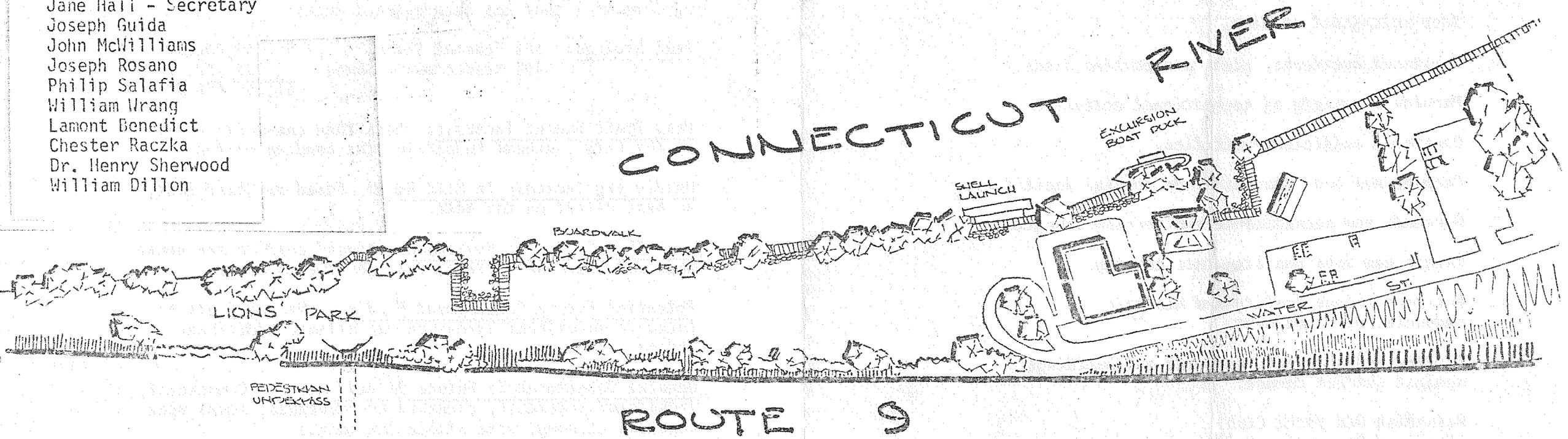
