REMARKS

On Wednesday 02-17-2016 at approximately 2140 hours Detective Peck and I, (Detective Lathrop) were traveling S/B on High Street near the intersection of Lincoln Street in an unmarked Middletown Police vehicle. Prior to us being in that area MPD dispatch put out a BOLO for a black Honda Accord bearing CT registration marker 3ATUJ9 wanted in connection for a possible assault at 49 Park Place apartment A.

Approximately twenty minutes prior to the call for service on Park Place, Detective Peck and I had traveled S/B on Park Place. We had observed a black four door vehicle parked on the east side of Park Place with the driver door open and a heavy set black woman (Chanel Bartell) with long hair sitting in the driver seat.

As we were heading S/B on High Street the above vehicle was stopped at the red traffic signal at the intersection of High Street and Washington Street. The black Honda made a right turn onto Washington Street from High Street and began to head W/B. Detective Peck called in the above marker plate to confirm it was the one wanted from the call for service on Park Place. MPD dispatch confirmed the vehicle and I activated my emergency lights and siren and conducted an investigative motor vehicle stop on the black Honda.

Officer St. Peter observed the Honda flee W/B on Washington Street. He activated his siren, and began to pursue the Honda W/B on Washington Street. He immediately called out the fact that the vehicle was fleeing and the direction of travel. He observed the vehicle make a right turn and head N/B on Newfield Street and he called out the direction of travel over the radio again. He approached 90mph on Newfield Street, when he observed the fleeing vehicle slow to turn left and head W/B on Westfield Street. He called out the direction of travel again. The operator of the vehicle pulled over just east of Old Mill Road, on Westfield Street. Officer St. Peter called out the location of the stop as Lieutenant Maturo called off the pursuit. SCU Detectives called out that there may be a weapon in the vehicle, because someone was reaching under the seat. The operator immediately opened the driver door of the vehicle. He told the operator to stay in the vehicle, but again she attempted to exit. At that point he unlocked his patrol rifle and pointed it at the driver. He again told the driver to remain in the vehicle until she was instructed to exit. Officer Jeffries and Detective Stead arrived to the secondary stop location. Detective Stead then called the driver out of the vehicle. The driver was placed in handcuffs by Officer Jeffries and detained without further incident.

After AP3 was secured in a cruiser, Detective Stead searched the vehicle incident to arrest. During the search of the vehicle he found the following:

A glass jar containing a green leafy-type substance, suspected to be marijuana, on the driver's seat.

A ziplock-type bag containing several smaller bags, each filled with suspected marijuana, in the pocket of the front passenger door.

A ziplock-type bag containing two types of round, white pills, in the glovebox

Detective Stead transported those items back to Middletown Police Headquarters to be tagged as evidence. The suspected marijuana tested positive for the presumptive presence of THC using NARK test kit # 8. The marijuana in the glass jar was separated into 4 bags with a total weight of 18 grams on the department scale. The ziplock bag contained 20

individual bags of marijuana weighing a total of 20.70 grams on the department scale.

A few minutes later a heavyset black female approached on foot walking west on Westfield Street who identified herself to Officer Froberg as Chanel Bartell. Bartell indicated to him that the Honda was hers and wanted to drive it home. Officer Froberg informed her she would not be able to at this time and inquired with her as to who had her vehicle over on Park Place and whether she had been there. Bartell initially denied knowing anything about anything to do with Park Place but then admitted that she had some "beef" with her baby father's new girlfriend who lives at 49 Park Place but refused to provide any names. Bartell added that apparently said female had called the Department of Children and Families (DCF) on her for no reason and that she had gone to 49 Park Place to confront her about it. Bartell would not provide Officer Froberg with any further details regarding the confrontation.

Sergeant Bartolotta then advised Officer Froberg to take Bartell into custody and transport her into headquarters for the street crime unit.

The three suspects of the assault were secured and detained so responding Officers went to 49 Park Place to attempt to locate any possible witnesses or victims from the original assault call for service. Officer Remotti and Officer DiMassa then went 49 Park Place and when they arrived, they were met by several people.

Officer Remotti was quickly approached by a female identified Victim 1 who stated she was an occupant of apartment A and the victim. When asked, Victim 1 stated she was injured and had head pain. Officer Remotti requested Hunter's Ambulance to respond to evaluate Victim 1. Victim 1 provided a fully detailed sworn written statement in which she explains the following;

At approximately 2130, Victim 1 was sitting in her bedroom watching a movie with two friends while her 9 year old son played a video game in the nearby living room. One of her friends, who resides on the second floor left side of the same building left to go get a cigarette from her residence but quickly returned. As she entered the front steps, Victim 1 heard her talking to another female whom she immediately recognized as her boyfriend's ex-girlfriend, Bartell. Because of past conflicts with Bartell and a threat of physical violence received by Victim 1 earlier in the evening via her cell phone, Victim 1 ran to lock her door before Bartell could gain entry.

As Victim 1 did this, Bartell became angry and began pounding on the window to the right of the entry door. She pounded so hard the entire lower sash of the window became dislodged forcing it into Victim 1's bedroom on the other side. Victim 1 who returned to the bedroom, watched as Bartell crawled into her residence through the opening. Bartell then picked up the sash off the floor and threw it at Victim 1 striking her on the left side of her forehead causing a small laceration, a contusion, redness swelling and pain. Victim 1 quickly got up and ran into the living room taking hold of her son. She ran with him to his bedroom where she instructed him to lock his door and hide. She then proceeded to the bathroom where she locked the door and called 911. As the call connected and the 911 dispatcher answered, Bartell forced her way through the door and began punching Victim 1 in the face, body and head. She then ripped the phone from Victim 1's hand and disabled it.

Victim 1 struggled to remove herself from the bathroom and proceeded into the kitchen where Bartell followed and continued her assault. Bartell grabbed several items in plain view and threw them striking Victim 1's head and body. These items included a glass plate and metal spoons. Concerned Bartell would obtain a knife, she ran from the kitchen to her

bedroom where Bartell pushed her to the floor and punched her additional times. At this point, Victim 1 thought she was going to die. While in the bedroom, Victim 1's male friend who was in the living room, told Bartell to leave. She stopped her assault and exited through the same window she entered.

It should be noted that during the entire duration Bartell was within the residence, the 9 year old child of Victim 1 was crying loudly, and screaming "STOP" and "MOMMY HELP ME". Victim 1 stated she could not locate her phone after the incident and that Bartell left with it. Utilizing a phone tracking application, Victim 1 stated her phone was last in the geographical area of Rapallo Avenue and Green Street, was moving, but had since lost the signal.

Victim 1 reported feeling soreness all over her body during interview with her. She was evaluated by Hunter's Ambulance Service on scene but refused treatment and transport to the hospital. She was provided instruction by the ambulance staff to watch for signs and symptoms of possible injuries as well as instruction to call 911 should she change her mind. Victim 1 wishes to press charges against Bartell to the fullest extent of the law.

Upon arrival at MPD HQ Detective Peck spoke with Chanel Bartell in the booking area. Bartell was advised of her rights and waived them in writing. She stated she would be willing to give a statement in regards to her involvement in the incident at 49 Park Pl.

Bartell was interviewed, by Lt. Davis and Detective Peck in a booking room and the interview was both audio and video recorded. During the interview, Bartell stated she had gone to the driven her car, with both AP2 and AP3, to Park Pl. She stated she had gone to the residence to confront a female in regards to a past issue. She stated that both AP2 and AP3 knew why she was going there. Bartell stated they told her it was a bad idea, but never attempted to stop her. Bartell stated upon arrival at the residence, she told AP3 to sit in the front seat while she went to the house. Bartell stated she knocked at the door loudly, but no one answered. She stated that eventually Victim 1 came to the window and the two argued for a short time. Bartell stated that after several minutes of arguing, Victim 1 walked away from the window and told her she was going to call the police. She stated that she was so angry that she decided to climb into the residence, through the window and confront Victim 1 "face to face." Bartell stated that at one point during the confrontation she felt she had made a bad decision due to the fact Victim 1's young son was home, but continued regardless. She stated while inside the residence Victim 1 hid in a closet while she threw a candle holder, a plate and cooking utensils around the home. Bartell stated she wasn't sure where exactly Victim 1 had hidden, so she decided to leave. Bartell stated while she was looking for the door, Victim 1 came out of her hiding spot and began "running her mouth." Bartell stated she went after Victim 1, but was restrained by an unknown neighbor. She stated she eventually walked out the door and back to the area where she had parked her car. Bartell stated that as she got to the road, she realized AP2 and AP3 had left the area with her vehicle.

Bartell stated she then began walking to her home, 25 Fisher Rd. She stated as she arrived home she noticed police cars were had stopped what appeared to be her vehicle, on Westfield St.

Bartell was photographed, booked, and processed under UAR# 8872659 in violation of CGS 53a-136 Robbery 3rd degree, 53a-183b Interfering with Emergency call, 53a-60 Assault 2nd, 53a-63 Reckless Endangerment 1st, 21a-279(c) Possession of Marijuana, 21a-279(b) Possession with Intent to Sell, 53-21 Risk of Injury, 53a-117 Criminal Mischief 3rd,

53a-62 Threatening 2nd, and 53a-100aa Home Invasion. Bartell was placed in a MPD female holding cell and held on a \$250,000 cash or surety bond awaiting her court date of 02-18-2016.

Bartell has no prior convictions.

During the course of this investigation none of the arrested parties would claim responsibility for the marijuana located inside of the vehicle. All arrested parties were seen in the vehicle by MPD personnel prior to the marijuana being found so all were subsequently charged. The cash found on the person of _____ (\$240.00) and cell phones were seized under asset forfeiture.

The value of the marijuana if sold at \$20.00 a gram would be \$774.00.

The black Honda pulled to the right side of Washington Street just past the intersection with Park Place, slowed down but did not stop. The Honda slowed down to approximately 5mph, rolled approximately 100 yards and then came to a stop. Detective Peck approached the passenger side and I approached the driver side. We identified ourselves as Police Officers and I immediately heard Detective Peck tell the front passenger to stop reaching under the seat. I could see the front passenger, later positively identified as ARRESTED PARTY 2 (AP2), from my position on the driver side, reach up from under the seat. Detective Peck ordered the operator to turn off the car. Detective Peck ordered AP2 to get out of the vehicle and to keep his hands where he could see them. I ordered the operator (later positively identified as Nina McDaniel) to turn off the vehicle and to get out of the vehicle. McDaniel got out of the vehicle and as she did, so did AP2. Before I could start to ask McDaniel questions about her possible involvement on Park Place, AP2 began to immediately pull away from Detective Peck and try to get by him. Detective Peck grabbed AP2 before he could get by him and AP2 started to struggle with Detective Peck. I observed AP2 reaching towards his pants area as Detective Peck was struggling with AP2. I did not see AP2 throw any contraband so I believed AP2 might be reaching for a weapon. I immediately went to assist Detective Peck with AP2 and as I did I verbally instructed McDaniel to stay near the vehicle.

Detective Peck and I attempted to gain control of AP2 on the side of Washington Street and he attempted to flee. Detective Peck had grabbed ahold of AP2's left shoulder and then got him to stop advancing and reaching for his midsection. I ran over and attempted to grab ahold of AP2 but Detective Peck had grabbed ahold of AP2 with both arms. I knocked over AP2 and Detective Peck onto the grass area. AP2, Detective Peck, and I all fell to the ground. We continued to try to gain control of AP2 and we continued to tell AP2 to stop resisting but he did not comply. AP2 had both arms underneath his body and refused to give up control. We could both feel AP2 still actively trying to reach for something near his midsection. Detective Peck and I heard tires squeal as we were actively fighting with AP2 and I observed the Honda take off at a high rate of speed.

Concerned AP1 would obtain a knife, she ran from the kitchen to her bedroom where AP1

pushed her to the floor and punched her additional times. At this point, V1 thought she was going to die. While in the bedroom, V1's male friend who was in the living room, told AP1 to leave. She stopped her assault and exited through the same window she entered.

It should be noted that during the entire duration AP1 was within the residence, the 9 year old child of V1 was crying loudly, and screaming "STOP" and "MOMMY HELP ME". V1 stated she could not locate her phone after the incident and that AP1 left with it. Utilizing a phone tracking application, V1 stated her phone was last in the geographical area of Rapallo Avenue and Green Street, was moving, but had since lost the signal.

V1 reported feeling soreness all over her body during my interview with her. She was evaluated by Hunter's Ambulance Service on scene but refused treatment and transport to the hospital. She was provided instruction by the ambulance staff to watch for signs and symptoms of possible injuries as well as instruction to call 911 should she change her mind. SV1 wishes to press charges against AP1 to the fullest extent of the law.

Detective Julia responded to the scene to photograph and document the interior and exterior of the structure as well as the visible injuries to V1's head. See Detective Julia's supplemental report for further details. A copy of the CD with 47 photographs of the scene was submitted as evidence.

Upon arrival at MPD HQ Detective Peck spoke with AP1 in the booking area. AP1 was advised of her rights and waived them in writing. She stated she would be willing to give a statement in regards to her involvement in the incident at 49 Park Pl.

AP1 was interviewed, by Lt. Davis and Detective Peck in a booking room and the interview was both audio and video recorded. During the interview, AP1 stated she had gone to the driven her car, with both ARRESTED PARTY 2 (AP2) and Nina McDaniel, to Park Pl. She stated she had gone to the residence to confront a female (V1) in regards to a past issue. She stated that both AP2 and McDaniel knew why she was going there. AP1 stated they told her it was a bad idea, but never attempted to stop her. AP1 stated upon arrival at the residence, she told McDaniel to sit in the front seat while she went to the house. AP1 stated she knocked at the door loudly, but no one answered. She stated that eventually V1 came to the window and the two argued for a short time. AP1 stated that after several minutes of arguing, V1 walked away from the window and told her she was going to call the police. She stated that she was so angry that she decided to climb into the residence, through the window and confront V1 "face to face." AP1 stated that at one point during the confrontation she felt she had made a bad decision due to the fact V1's young son was home, but continued regardless. She stated while inside the residence V1 hid in a closet while she threw a candle holder, a plate and cooking utensils around the home. AP1 stated she wasn't sure where exactly V1 had hidden, so she decided to leave. AP1 stated while she was looking for the door, V1 came out of her hiding spot and began "running her mouth." AP1 stated she went after V1, but was restrained by an unknown neighbor. She stated she eventually walked out the door and back to the area where she had parked her car. AP1 stated that as she got to the road, she realized McDaniel and AP2 had left the area with her vehicle.

AP1 stated she then began walking to her home, 25 Fisher Rd. She stated as she arrived home she noticed police cars were had stopped what appeared to be her vehicle, on Westfield St.

Detective Peck then spoke with Nina McDaniel in the booking area. McDaniel was advised of her rights and waived them in writing. She stated she would be willing to give a statement in regards to her involvement in the incident at 49 Park Pl. as well as the motor vehicle stop on Washington St.

McDaniel was interviewed, by Lt. Davis and Detective Peck in a booking room and the interview was both audio and video recorded.

Nina McDaniel stated she and AP2 had gone to Park Pl. as passengers in AP1's car. She stated she is not very close with AP1 and wasn't sure what they were doing at the house. McDaniel stated that when AP1 exited the car to go speak with


V1, she told her to sit on the driver's seat. McDaniel stated she and [redacted] sat in the car briefly before moving it from Park Pl to Lincoln St. She stated that while she was waiting in the car on Lincoln St. she heard a female (V1) yell that she going to "call the cops." McDaniel stated she then decided to drive away. She stated as she was driving W/B on Washington St. she noticed the Police lights behind her and pulled over. McDaniel stated that AP2 told her that Detectives were pulling the car over. She stated that even though she saw our badges and Police lights and siren, she wasn't comfortable with plain clothes cops. McDaniel stated when she noticed Det. Lathrop and I fighting with AP2, she decided she wasn't "sticking around." When asked why she didn't drive directly to the Police Department, or call 911 on one of the (4) cell phones in the car, she could not provide an answer.

McDaniel was photographed, booked, and processed under UAR#'s 8872660, and 8872661 in violation of CGS 14-223(b)* Engaging Police in a Pursuit, 14-222 Reckless Driving greater than 85MPH, 14-223(a) Disobeying Signal of an Officer, 14-215 (b(2)(B) Enhanced Penalty Operation without License, CGS 53a-167a Interfering/Resisting, 21a-279(c) Possession of Marijuana, 21a-279(b) Possession with Intent to Sell, 53a-48/53a-100aa Conspiracy to Commit Home Invasion. McDaniel was placed in a MPD female holding cell and held on a \$250,000 cash or surety bond awaiting her court date of 02-18-2016.

McDaniel has no prior convictions.

During the course of this investigation none of the arrested parties would claim responsibility for the marijuana located inside of the vehicle. All arrested parties were seen in the vehicle by MPD personnel prior to the marijuana being found so all were subsequently charged. The value of the marijuana if sold at \$20.00 a gram would be \$774.00.


REMARKS

REMARKS

On 2/17/16 at approximately 2005hrs Officer Jeffries and I (Officer Wasilewski) were dispatched to a residence in Middletown for a report of a physical domestic. The victim (hereby referred to as Victim 1 or V1) called 911 stating that his girlfriend (hereby referred to as Suspect 1 or S1) had punched him in the face. Upon our arrival, Officer Jeffries and I (Officer Wasilewski) were met by V1 who was sitting on his front



V1 stated the right side of his face felt swollen. Officer Jeffries and I observed slight redness on the right side of his face by his cheek. (See two photographs of V1's facial redness attached and submitted with the case documents). This Officer (Officer Wasilewski) later confirmed S1 was left handed, matching the redness to the right side of V1's face.


S1 was met outside where Officer Jeffries and I attempted to speak with her. I explained to S1 that I wanted to get her side of the story. S1 replied "I don't have to say shit!" Eventually, when I asked if they got into a fight all she stated was "Well yea I definitely hit him cause he wouldn't fucking leave!" I then tried to get her to explain more but she again refused.

S1 was transported to the Middletown Police Department where she was processed. Before starting the booking process I provided her with one last opportunity to waiver her rights and speak with me. S1 did not sign the Waiver portion of the Notice of Rights form. I did not attempt to ask her anything further related to the domestic due to her refusal to sign the waiver. S1 was charged with violation of CGS 53a-61 Assault 3rd and 53a-182 Disorderly Conduct. After being read her rights she was processed, photographed, and fingerprinted. S1 was assigned a next day court date of 2/18/16 at 0900hrs and released on a \$5,000 Non Surety Bond. It was explained to her that she would have to appear at the GA 9 Court House on that date and time.

S1 was also issued a Family Violence Conditions of Release with the following stipulations imposed" CT01, CT03, and CT05. Additionally conditions stating "Do not possess a dangerous weapon" and " Do not use or possess an intoxicant or controlled substance" were also imposed.

REMARKS

On Wednesday 02-17-2016 at approximately 2140 hours Detective Peck and I, (Detective Lathrop) were traveling S/B on High Street near the intersection of Lincoln Street in an unmarked Middletown Police vehicle. Prior to us being in that area MPD dispatch put out a BOLO for a black Honda Accord bearing CT registration marker 3ATUJ9 wanted in connection for a possible assault at 49 Park Place apartment A.

Approximately twenty minutes prior to the call for service on Park Place, Detective Peck and I had traveled S/B on Park Place. We had observed a black four door vehicle parked on the east side of Park Place with the driver door open and a heavy set black woman with long hair sitting in the driver seat.

As we were heading S/B on High Street the above vehicle was stopped at the red traffic signal at the intersection of High Street and Washington Street. The black Honda made a right turn onto Washington Street from High Street and began to head W/B. Detective Peck called in the above marker plate to confirm it was the one wanted from the call for service on Park Place. MPD dispatch confirmed the vehicle and I activated my emergency lights and siren and conducted an investigative motor vehicle stop on the black Honda.

The black Honda pulled to the right side of Washington Street just past the intersection with Park Place, slowed down but did not stop. The Honda slowed down to approximately 5mph, rolled approximately 100 yards and then came to a stop. Detective Peck approached the passenger side and I approached the driver side. We identified ourselves as Police Officers and I immediately heard Detective Peck tell the front passenger to stop reaching under the seat. I could see the front passenger (later positively identified as Michael V. Jackson) from my position on the driver side, reach up from under the seat. Detective Peck ordered the operator to turn off the car. Detective Peck ordered Jackson to get out of the vehicle and to keep his hands where he could see them. I ordered the operator to turn off the vehicle and to get out of the vehicle. The operator got out of the vehicle and as she did, so did Jackson. Before I could start to ask the operator questions about her possible involvement on Park Place Jackson began to immediately pull away from Detective Peck and try to get by him. Detective Peck grabbed Jackson before he could get by him and Jackson started to struggle with Detective Peck. I observed Jackson reaching towards his pants area as Detective Peck was struggling with Jackson. I did not see Jackson throw any contraband so I believed Jackson might be reaching for a weapon. I immediately went to assist Detective Peck with Jackson and as I did I verbally instructed the operator to stay near the vehicle.

Detective Peck and I attempted to gain control of Jackson on the side of Washington Street and he attempted to flee.

Detective Peck had grabbed ahold of Jackson's left shoulder and then got him to stop advancing and reaching for his midsection. I ran over and attempted to grab ahold of Jackson but Detective Peck had grabbed ahold of Jackson with both arms. I knocked over Jackson and Detective Peck onto the grass area. Jackson, Detective Peck, and I all fell to the ground. We continued to try to gain control of Jackson and we continued to tell Jackson to stop resisting but he did not comply. Jackson had both arms underneath his body and refused to give up control. We could both feel Jackson still actively trying to reach for something near his midsection. Detective Peck and I heard tires squeal as we were actively fighting with Jackson and I observed the Honda take off at a high rate of speed. Detective Peck and I still did not have control of Jackson so we began to strike Jackson with body blows with closed fists. Jackson started to give up control of his right arm briefly but he again started reaching towards his waistline. At that time it was clear to us Jackson was attempting to reach for something, possibly a weapon. Detective Peck and I continued to attempt to gain control of Jackson's arms and to keep him from reaching for what he was trying to get. I was able to pull Jackson's right arm out and secure it into one handcuff. A short time later Detective Peck got control of Jackson's left arm and he was secured in handcuffs. Jackson then stated "You got me, it's in my pocket". Detective Peck asked Jackson what he had and Jackson stated "a gun man, a gun". I asked Jackson where the gun was and he stated it was in his jacket pocket. We rolled over Jackson and I immediately felt the gun in his right front jacket pocket. Detective Peck kept a hold of Jackson by the shoulder and I reached into his pocket and secured the gun. I placed the gun on the ground a safe distance away from Jackson. At that time Officer Milardo who arrived on scene, took possession of the firearm. (See Officer Milardo's supplement). I conducted a more thorough putdown of Jackson once the firearm was secured. Nothing else was found on the person of Jackson except for the firearm. His wallet and cell phone were recovered on the grass a short distance away from where we fell to the ground.

Officer Milardo put on a glove and made the firearm safe. Officer Milardo ejected a live round from the chamber and removed the magazine which had 3 rounds. The firearm was transported to HQ by Officer's Difonzo and Milardo along with Jackson in their vehicle.

Once back at MPD headquarters, Officer Difonzo photographed the firearm, a Taurus PT732 .32ACP and one magazine along with 4 rounds. He then placed it in an evidence box and secured it into a MPD evidence locker. Officer Milardo ran the serial number (57330B) through central dispatch. The firearm is not reported stolen and is not registered to anyone. There will be an ATF trace on the recovered firearm for a more compressive search.

Officer St. Peter observed the Honda flee W/B on Washington Street. He activated his siren, and began to pursue the Honda W/B on Washington Street. He immediately called out the fact that the vehicle was fleeing and the direction of travel. He observed the vehicle make a right turn and head N/B on Newfield Street and he called out the direction of travel over the radio again. He approached 90mph on Newfield Street, when he observed the fleeing vehicle slow to turn left and head W/B on Westfield Street. He called out the direction of travel again. The operator of the vehicle pulled over just east of Old Mill Road, on Westfield Street. Officer St. Peter called out the location of the stop as Lieutenant Maturo called off the pursuit. SCU Detectives called out that there may be a weapon in the vehicle, because someone was reaching under the seat. The operator immediately opened the driver door of the vehicle. He told the operator to stay in the vehicle, but again she attempted to exit. At that point he unlocked his patrol rifle and pointed it at the driver. He again told the driver to remain in the vehicle until she was instructed to exit. Officer Jeffries and Detective Stead arrived to the secondary stop location. Detective Stead then called the driver out of the vehicle. The driver was placed in handcuffs by Officer Jeffries and detained without further incident.

After the operator was secured in a cruiser, Detective Stead searched the vehicle incident to arrest. During the search of the vehicle he found the following:

A glass jar containing a green leafy-type substance, suspected to be marijuana, on the driver's seat.

A ziplock-type bag containing several smaller bags, each filled with suspected marijuana, in the pocket of the front passenger door.

A ziplock-type bag containing two types of round, white pills, in the glovebox

Detective Stead transported those items back to Middletown Police Headquarters to be tagged as evidence. The suspected marijuana tested positive for the presumptive presence of THC using NARK test kit # 8. The marijuana in the glass jar was separated into 4 bags with a total weight of 18 grams on the department scale. The ziplock bag contained 20 individual bags of marijuana weighing a total of 20.70 grams on the department scale.

A few minutes later a heavyset black female approached on foot walking west on Westfield Street who identified herself to Officer Froberg. The black female indicated to him that the Honda was hers and wanted to drive it home. Officer Froberg informed her she would not be able to at this time and inquired with her as to who had her vehicle over on Park Place and whether she had been there. The black female initially denied knowing anything about anything to do with Park Place but then admitted that she had some "beef" with her baby father's new girlfriend who lives at 49 Park Place but refused to provide any names. The black female added that apparently said female had called the Department of Children and Families (DCF) on her for no reason and that she had gone to 49 Park Place to confront her about it. The black female would not provide Officer Froberg with any further details regarding the confrontation.

Sergeant Bartolotta then advised Officer Froberg to take the black female into custody and transport her into headquarters for the street crime unit. Ofc. St.Pierre then properly handcuffed the arrested party (1) (double locked / checked for tightness) at which time she was secured in the rear caged area of his cruiser. Officer Froberg then transported AP1 to Middletown Police HQ.

The three suspects of the assault were secured and detained so responding Officers went to 49 Park Place to attempt to locate any possible witnesses or victims from the original assault call for service. Officer Remotti and Officer DiMassa then went 49 Park Place and when they arrived, they were met by several people.

Officer Remotti was quickly approached by a female Victim 1 who stated she was an occupant of apartment A and the victim. When asked, Victim 1 stated she was injured and had head pain. Officer Remotti requested Hunter's Ambulance to respond to evaluate Victim 1. Victim 1 provided a fully detailed sworn written statement in which she explains the following;

At approximately 2130, Victim 1 was sitting in her bedroom watching a movie with two friends while her 9 year old son played a video game in the nearby living room. One of her friends, who resides on the second floor left side of the same building left to go get a cigarette from her residence but quickly returned. As she entered the front steps, Victim 1 heard her talking to another female whom she immediately recognized as her boyfriend's ex-girlfriend, AP1. Because of past conflicts with AP1 and a threat of physical violence received by Victim 1 earlier in the evening via her cell phone, Victim 1

ran to lock her door before AP1 could gain entry.

As Victim 1 did this, AP1 became angry and began pounding on the window to the right of the entry door. She pounded so hard the entire lower sash of the window became dislodged forcing it into Victim 1 's bedroom on the other side. Victim 1 who returned to the bedroom, watched as AP1 crawled into her residence through the opening. AP1 then picked up the sash off the floor and threw it at Victim 1 striking her on the left side of her forehead causing a small laceration, a contusion, redness swelling and pain. Victim 1 quickly got up and ran into the living room taking hold of her son. She ran with him to his bedroom where she instructed him to lock his door and hide. She then proceeded to the bathroom where she locked the door and called 911. As the call connected and the 911 dispatcher answered, AP1 forced her way through the door and began punching Victim 1 in the face, body and head. She then ripped the phone from Victim 1 's hand and disabled it.

Victim 1 struggled to remove herself from the bathroom and proceeded into the kitchen where AP1 followed and continued her assault. AP1 grabbed several items in plain view and threw them striking Victim 1's head and body. These items included a glass plate and metal spoons. Concerned AP1 would obtain a knife, she ran from the kitchen to her bedroom where AP1 pushed her to the floor and punched her additional times. At this point, Victim 1 thought she was going to die. While in the bedroom, Victim 1's male friend who was in the living room, told AP1 to leave. She stopped her assault and exited through the same window she entered.

It should be noted that during the entire duration AP1 was within the residence, the 9 year old child of Victim 1 was crying loudly, and screaming "STOP" and "MOMMY HELP ME". Victim 1 stated she could not locate her phone after the incident and that AP1 left with it. Utilizing a phone tracking application, Victim 1 stated her phone was last in the geographical area of Rapallo Avenue and Green Street, was moving, but had since lost the signal.

Victim 1 reported feeling soreness all over her body during my interview with her. She was evaluated by Hunter's Ambulance Service on scene but refused treatment and transport to the hospital. She was provided instruction by the ambulance staff to watch for signs and symptoms of possible injuries as well as instruction to call 911 should she change her mind. Victim 1 wishes to press charges against AP1 to the fullest extent of the law.

Detective Julia responded to the scene to photograph and document the interior and exterior of the structure as well as the visible injuries to Victim 1 's head. See Detective Julia's supplemental report for further details. A copy of the CD with 47 photographs of the scene was submitted as evidence.

Upon arrival at MPD HQ Detective Peck spoke with AP1 in the booking area. AP1 was advised of her rights and waived them in writing. She stated she would be willing to give a statement in regards to her involvement in the incident at 49 Park Pl.

AP1 was interviewed, by Lt. Davis and Detective Peck in a booking room and the interview was both audio and video recorded. During the interview, AP1 stated she had gone to the driven her car, with both AP2 and AP3, to Park Pl. She stated she had gone to the residence to confront a female (Victim 1) in regards to a past issue. She stated that both AP2 and AP3 knew why she was going there. AP1 stated they told her it was a bad idea, but never attempted to stop her. AP1

stated upon arrival at the residence, she told AP3 to sit in the front seat while she went to the house. AP1 stated she knocked at the door loudly, but no one answered. She stated that eventually Victim 1 came to the window and the two argued for a short time. AP1 stated that after several minutes of arguing, Victim 1 walked away from the window and told her she was going to call the police. She stated that she was so angry that she decided to climb into the residence, through the window and confront Victim 1 "face to face." AP1 stated that at one point during the confrontation she felt she had made a bad decision due to the fact Victim 1's young son was home, but continued regardless. She stated while inside the residence Victim 1 hid in a closet while she threw a candle holder, a plate and cooking utensils around the home. AP1 stated she wasn't sure where exactly Victim 1 had hidden, so she decided to leave. AP1 stated while she was looking for the door, Victim 1 came out of her hiding spot and began "running her mouth." AP1 stated she went after Victim 1, but was restrained by an unknown neighbor. She stated she eventually walked out the door and back to the area where she had parked her car. AP1 stated that as she got to the road, she realized AP2 and AP3 had left the area with her vehicle.

AP1 stated she then began walking to her home. She stated as she arrived home she noticed police cars were had stopped what appeared to be her vehicle, on Westfield St.


Jackson was photographed, booked, and processed under UAR #8872662 in violation of CGS 53a-167a Interfering/Resisting, 21a-279(c) Possession of Marijuana, 21a-279(b) Possession with Intent to Sell, 53a-167c Assault of a Public Safety Officer, 53a-49/53a-59 Criminal Attempt to Commit Assault 1st, 53a-117, 29-38 Weapon in a Motor Vehicle, 53a-48/53a-100aa Conspiracy to Commit Home Invasion, 53-206d Carrying a Firearm while under the Influence of Alcohol/Drugs, and 29-35 Carrying of a Pistol or Revolver without a Permit. Jackson was placed in a MPD male holding cell and held on a \$500,000 cash or surety bond awaiting his court date of 02-18-2016.

Jackson has prior convictions of Burglary 1st, Interfering/Resisting, Assault 1st, Assault 2nd, Carrying of a Pistol or Revolver without a Permit, and Probation Violation.

During the course of this investigation none of the arrested parties would claim responsibility for the marijuana located inside of the vehicle. All arrested parties were seen in the vehicle by MPD personnel prior to the marijuana being found so all were subsequently charged. The cash found on the person of Jackson (\$240.00) and cell phones were seized under asset forfeiture.

The value of the marijuana if sold at \$20.00 a gram would be \$774.00.
